Presidents Report

SUMMARY

I hope all our members enjoyed fair winds this summer. With excellent wind and swell conditions the summer of 2016/17 proved to be the best for some time. It certainly kept the WAKSA committee busy running a number of events and dealing with a range of kiting issues.

This summer also saw a significant achievement for the sport not only in West Australia but throughout the country with the introduction of Kiteboarding Australia's new Kite School curriculum. The conversion of schools in WA to this will mean a more consistent accountable teaching method which will hopefully lead to a greater awareness of best safe kiteboarding practices out on our beaches. The feedback to the new curriculum from the relevant authorities has only been positive. Councils in particular are keen to have the assurance that Kite Schools operating in their areas are administered by an Australian organisation.

Other achievements also saw the submission by WAKSA to become the official State Sporting Association and the successful lobbying by WAKSA of Marine Safety to introduce the ISO standard for lifejackets. This will mean a lot more flexibility in the type of lifejackets that are worn when kitesurfing.

The calibre and variety of kiting events continues to grow in WA. Along with consistent State Titles in all three disciplines we are now seeing a clearer pathway for kiters wanting to increase and showcase their skills via competition. Well supported wave events like the Lancelin Classic combined with new additions like the Hydrofoil Pro Tour event reflect the passion not only the kiters have for their sport but the organisers and volunteers alike.

I'd like to thank all who contributed to WAKSA this season. Special mention to departing committee member Wayne Hyslop on his work adventure. Wishing him and all our members a safe winter. Looking forward to another windy summer next year!

WAKSA's social media presence has been another great success over the past year that will continue to grow next season with many marketing lessons learnt.

Treasurer's Report and Financial Summary

This was a tough year financially as a large proportion of our funding from the national body KA, was drastically reduced. We focused on running events that would 'break even' and reducing as many overheads as possible. Whilst there are some further expenses that need to be finalized – see 'Transactions Pending' – we have still managed to post a surplus of around \$2500.

Our main expenses this year were as follows:

Events: \$3800

WAKSA helped organize and fund the state titles for waves, freestyle and racing disciplines. We ran Kitestock again this year, albeit with a tight (naked) budget. Redkite also ran and the members helped to raise around \$6000 for this great charity. We also helped with NKL, Lighthouse to Leighton, and season openers both at the movies and on the water.

Marquees: \$1700

We decided it was finally time to do something about our ageing shade marquees. Instead of completely replacing at a cost of \sim \$3500 we decided we could replace the frames and have the canopies repaired.

Storage: \$1800

This is an expense that we managed to reduce a little this year by moving to a cheaper location. It is essential that our gear for events is easily accessible for the committee and event organisers.

Website and IT: \$750

Last year we got a brand new website so we just had to make a final instalment on that. This year we are hoping to secure a grant to improve all things IT including the programs we use, the website and maybe some new hardware.

Insurance: \$0

After consultation with the DSR and KA it was decided that we could drop our insurance cover for the committee members this year. The committee members are now covered under a central national policy. This was a large drop in expenses for the year.

Secretary's Report

Due to the amount of events that WAKSA organised this year, and a relatively small and new committee, this year was a steep learning curve. Being new to the role, I thought and event was easy: rock up to the beach, pitch a marquee and compete. Well, an event is much more than that... To hold a small event on a WA beach and in the water, WAKSA needs approval from the council (most times we even have to pay for the use of the beach), we need approval from the DOT to hold an event on the water and in some locations we need approval from DPAW! A single event requires a risk management plan to be drafted and countless of forms to be filled in – all 6 weeks before the event is to take place. Needless to say, this year's learning, was mainly around tedious event admin. This said, relationships with councils and government agencies that have been built up from previous committees were kept and even improved and we have plans in place to document event application procedures, in the winter, to ensure future committees have the tools needed to run events seamlessly.

STRATEGIC HIGHLIGHTS

Our main strategic highlights for WAKSA during the 2016/17 year are best summarised as below.

- Lodgement of the application for State Sporting Organisation Status with the Department of Sport and Recreation
- Analysis on ICT requirements for WAKSA to secure funding from DSR to support our IT strategy
- Analysis of costs and making a significant reduction in operational expenses
