standards with the growth of our sport, including implementing the National Integrity Framework with Kiteboarding Australia and Sport Integrity Australia. We value our partnership with DLGSC, with special thanks to our consultant Cameron Agnew, and look forward to continued collaboration.

2022/23 has witnessed another successful year of advocacy for the sport with KWA upholding strong relationships with significant key stakeholders. Executive Board members provided a letter of feedback and recommendations in relation to the newly proposed kiteboarding launch area and costal management plan at Lancelin. Following this several meetings were held with key stakeholders and project leads. Ultimately our position of a win-win where the dune systems are preserved, but access for kiteboarding/winging and launching locations remain the same was able to be successfully put forward. We have also been acknowledged as a key stakeholder for further collaboration opportunities with the Gingin council.

Despite a challenging environment, KWA has emerged stronger thanks to our passionate community. I look forward to another impactful season ahead with WA delivering three national events across the various disciplines, growing participation, advocacy, and education for kiteboarding across Western Australia.

COACHING AND OFFICIATING REPORT



Thanks to the Department of Local Government, Sport and Cultural Industries (DLGSC), KWA successfully developed the first stages of Level 1 framework for officiating pathways and training and development. The program was trialed in Western Australia with the scope to roll out further across Australia in conjunction with Kiteboarding Australia. KWA has successfully secured funding from DLGSC to develop the next steps of the framework, in conjunction with Kiteboarding Australia, British Kitesports Association and GKA. The development is an exciting progression for the sport, setting it up for high quality official development across Australia and Internationally, raising the standard of events and increasing the capacity of the organisation.





JUNIOR PROGRESSION SESSIONS SEPTEMBER 2022 - FEBRUARY 2023

In the season 2022/2023 we stepped up the junior development another notch from last year, providing more structure and more training opportunities.

The season took off with an opening event in September 2022 for all 16 juniors participating in the Junior Progressions Sessions to meet, define their goals, perform a small fitness test, and socialise during a BBQ dinner party. A part of the group spent the school holidays together in Exmouth to kick the season off with two weeks of structured kiting, working out and fun on the campsite, also covering the topics of conditioning & injury prevention, strategy & preparation. From mid-October, there were weekly water sessions at Woodman's Point going through to March when the Seabreeze slowly faded out.

January 2023 we had our highlight "Summer of the Pond" month with a week-long Junior Camp coached by international Pro Coach Fabio Ingrosso, the King of the Pond event with several juniors participating in the open field, the State and National Freestyle Titles with most of the juniors participating and all podium places of the Nationals filled with WA juniors.

The coming season will continue strong in the junior section, with a record number of juniors kiting, participating in the program and representing WA on a national and international level.

The Junior Progression Sessions continue to enable strong friendships among the juniors. The group regularly catches up on and off the water for kiteboarding road trips, to push each other's riding and train.

A huge thank you to all parents, coaches and volunteers enabling us to offer a strong and globally unique junior development program that supports our kiteboarding juniors in pursuing their passion.





Kiteboarding Western Australia (KWA) held several successful events across the 2022/23 season thanks to our dedicated volunteers, organisers and valued sponsors.

The KWA State Wave Titles was held in Lancelin and saw top wave riders compete at Back Beach. We thank Andre Cater, Mark Arkley and Luca de Prato for generously volunteering their time to judge and deliver this event on the day.
